

### 4 x 4 Strategy

- Four picture prompts or video prompts or a combination of both.
- Four Pictures / Four Minutes of Discussion / Four Minutes of Writing
   a full page of story / paragraph starts.
- Steps Show the image Four minutes of discussion share words, thoughts, ideas. Then Four minutes of quiet, idependent writing.
- (Pre-Covid) up move and change spots to knew picture


